

Event Details

The 2009 Amateur Athletic Union (AAU) / American Lindy Hop championships (ALHC) National Dance Championships will take place in Stamford, Connecticut on October 24 and 25, 2009 at the Plaza Hotel. The event is administered by ALHC, a division of Artspectrum and has been sanctioned by the AAU as part of the 2009-2010 competitive season.

The AAU annually sanctions the Junior Olympic Games in the USA. AAU Dance has schools, studios and all-star teams/clubs that take part in their program. Dance teams compete in divisions based on team size and grade/age level. Teams have the option of entering the following categories: jazz, tap, contemporary, ballet, lyrical, hip hop, ball-room and/or swing. Solo, duo and trio dancers have the option of entering jazz, tap, contemporary, ballet, lyrical and hip hop. There will be a Junior Swing Championship for

those aged 10-19 this year.

All participants in the AAU divisions must be current members. The AAU membership year runs from September to August annually. In order to obtain a membership current for the competition dates you must either have a multi-year membership that does not expire until 8/31/09 or you can purchase a membership year beginning 8/15/09. This competition takes place in the 2010 AAU membership year. All memberships may be purchased beginning at \$12 easily online at www.aausports.org. Your number and card will be issued immediately with payment. Any questions about AAU membership can be directed to the membership department at 407.934.7200 or membership@aasusports.org.

Once your AAU membership is complete feel free to review and complete the enclosed forms and mail them to the address provided.

These forms are due with full payment for fees by September 25, 2009. Entries may be submitted after this date with an \$25 late charge per entry.

Call 203.359.1300 to make your reservation. Use American Lindy Hop Championships to get our group room rate of \$99 plus tax for 1-4 people in a room. And remember that you may come before October 24 and stay after October 25 at the same great rate.



Getting to the Championships

The 2009 AAU-ALHC National Dance Championships will be held at the Plaza Hotel and Conference Center in Stamford, Connecticut. It is conveniently located 1.5 miles away from the Stamford train station. It is 30 miles north of Manhattan providing easy access to Broadway, Times Square, Central Park, museums, shopping and more.. To reserve a room call the Plaza at 203.359.1300. Rooms are \$99+tax each night. Please reserve your room by October 1 to ensure you get our group rate. After October 1 that rate will only be given is space is available.

By air Stamford can be accessed from any of the airports in the New York area. Westchester County Airport (HPN) in White Plains, NY is the closest to the hotel. However, you may choose to fly into JFK, La-Guardia and Islip in New York or Danbury or Hartford in Connecticut. Private shut-

From I-95 traveling south take exit 34 onto North State Street, at the second light turn right onto Atlantic which becomes Bedford. Enter the hotel on the left.

From Merritt Parkway/Route! 5 traveling north take exit 34, turn right onto Long Ridge Road. It becomes Summer Street. Enter the hotel on the left after it becomes Summer Street.

2009 Contest Categories

Acrobatic Rock 'n' Roll

This category features elements like lifts, jumps, throws and flips. It is danced to tempos of 178bpm to 208bpm.

Ballroom Team

8+ dancers perform one or more ballroom dance styles in formations. Team categories are judged on projection, showmanship, choreography, technique and teamwork.

Classical Ballet

Dancers execute ballet technique in either a classical or neo-classical form dressed in ballet footwear.

Collegiate Couples' Swing

Couples' perform a recognizable swing dance style as a Classic (no lifts) for Showcase (lifts, throws allowed).

Collegiate Swing Team

All dancers perform one or more swing dance style. Vernacular jazz may or may not be included. This category is judged on timing, teamwork and formations.

Contemporary Ballet

Dancers execute ballet technique styled and accompanied with modern jazz or contemporary choreography and music dressed in ballet footwear...

Clogging

All dancers wear clogging shoes and execute clogging technique including but not limited to rhythmic patterns and formations.

Dance Team

A high energy routine having sharp, precise movements.. Routines are judged on technique and choreography. (Dance teams are not limited to this category if their content is better suited to another category such as hip hop, jazz or musical theater.)

Ethnic/Folkloric

A dance style of a particular ethnic group, including but not limited to national dances.

qoH qiH

A routine which makes use of one or more street dance

styles like popping, locking, breaking, footwork, krumping and freezes to hip hop music.

Jazz

8+ dancers execute movement and styling characteristic of American Jazz dance..

Junior Swing Championship Dancers aged 10 to 19 perform a dance based in one or more of the swing dance styles.

Latin Team

8+ dancers perform one or more Latin/American Rhythm dance styles in formation.

Lyrical

All dancers interpret the lyrics or mood (intent) of a song using a combination of ballet, modern and/or jazz dance techniques. This category includes the use of legwork, balance and body language

displaying one's emotion. Modern/Contemporary

Demonstrates balance, extension, flexion, isolation and control.. Movement, without or without a prescribed vocabulary, is based on the elements of dance-space, time manipulation, dynamics and the movement qualities.

Music Theater

A routine choreographed to a song from a Broadway or movie musical which stays in the character of the play/character making use of any style of dance.

Open

A combination of any two or more dance styles or a dance routine that does not fit any listed category.

Swing Team

All dancers perform one or more swing dance style. Vernacular jazz may or may not be included. This category is judged on timing, teamwork and formations.

All dancers wear tap shoes and execute tap technique. The routine may include soft shoe and/or street tap. Routines may be performed to music or a cappella.

Rules and Regulations

Scheduling—All competitors are expected to be available from the beginning of the scheduled day and time to the end of the scheduled day and time.

Sportsmanship—All participants Agree to display good sportsmanship throughout the event. The advisor/coach of each team is responsible for seeing that team members coaches, parents and others affiliated with the team conduct themselves accordingly. Severe demonstrations are grounds for disqualification as explained below.

In the event that a performance is interrupted because of equipment failure, the facilities, etc will be presented again in its entirety at a time determined by the judging panel.

In the event a team's performance is interrupted because of The failure of the team's own equipment or supplies, the team must either continue the presentation or withdraw from the competition.

In the event that an injury causes the presentation of a team to be interrupted, the team must either continue the presentation or withdraw from the competition. The event staff reserves the right to stop the presentation due to injury if it is deemed necessary.

Interpretations and Rulings—Any other situations requiring interpretation of the rules or a decision involving any aspect of the competition not clearly specified in these Rules and Regulations shall be considered by the Head Judge, Contest Coordinator and another individual designated by the Event Director. The Committee will render judgments in an effort to insure that the event proceeds in a manner as equitable as possible to all teams and consistent with the general spirit of the rules and goals of the competition. All teams must agree to accept any and all decisions made by the Committee as final.

Judging Criteria—The judges will score all routines on a 100 point system. Judges will score all teams on projection and showmanship, choreography, technique and group execution; duos on timing, technique, teamwork and choreography; solos on tim-

ing, technique, choreography, showmanship and projection.

Scores and Rankings-

Individual score sheets are the exclusive use of each particular judge. Scores and rankings will be available only to coaches at the conclusion of the event. No scores or rankings will be given over the telephone.

Procedural Questions — Any questions concerning the rules of the competition, the scoring of the participants or the ranking of teams will be handled exclusively by the advisor/coach of the team. Any questions concerning a presentation should be made to the Contest Coordinator immediately after the performance.

Finality of Decisions—By participating in this championship, each team agrees that decisions by the judges will be final and not subject to review.

Music Guidelines-Each entry must be furnished on a quality CD only. Only one song per CD, no other music should precede or follow the competition song. Multiple tracks on a CD will not be accepted. Music must be clearly marked with the name of the routine and entry number. CDs must be in an individual CD jewel case/sleeve. Music is to be turned in at registration the day of the competition. Acapella entries should be turned in with a blank case. Teachers/Coaches should have a back-up CD readily available in the event of malfunction of the original.

AAU-ALHC National Dance Championships is not responsible for the quality of professional or home burnt CDs or their compatibility with venue playback equipment.

The event suggests that great consideration be given to music selection when choosing accompaniment for competition Each entry must furnish on quality CD only. Only one song per CD, no other music should precede or follow. Multiple tracks on a CD will not be accepted. Music must be clearly marked with the name of the routine and entry number. CDs must be in individual CD jewel case/sleeve.. Music is to be turned in at registration the day of the competition. Acapella en-

tries should be turned in with a blank case. Teachers/choreography. Songs which include overt profanity, vulgar language and/or innuendo are deemed unacceptable. All material presented, including costumes, should be age appropriate. Infractions will result in point deductions in the judge's scores and may cause a routine to be disqualified.

Pick up music at the end of the awards ceremony. The event is not responsible for CDs which are not retrieved.

Time Limits— Time limitations are 1:30-3 minutes for solos and duets; 1:45-4 minutes for small and large groups.

Entry Fees—Entry fees are payable in US funds only by check, money order, Visa, Master Card, Discover Card, PayPal or Google Checkout. Fees should be paid in full by the entry deadline

September 25, 2009 to avoid a late registration fee.

All entries and payments from studios, clubs or organizations must be submitted on one check, money order or credit card. Entry fees must arrive in the form one payment not individual payments from dancers. All checks returned by the bank for any reason will incur a service charge of \$35.00. Payment of restitution will be accepted by certified check, cashier's check or credit card only. If late entries are accepted they are subject to a \$25 fee per entry. This decision will me made at the discretion of the event. Please note the following dance fee schedule.

Duo-Trio \$120 per entry



Lindy Hop, a social dance, came into being when aviator Charles Lindbergh was all the rage after making his historic non-stop flight from New York to Paris in 1927.

Lindy's growth fed off the musicians of the era. At that time swing was the music not the dance. Improvisation and syncopations are a hallmark of jazz/swing music. As a result they are also important elements both lindy and tap.

During the Swing Era flying

swingouts and flying circles incorporated tap footwork. To-day the rhythms are pretty standard. Lindy, one of the many triple time swing dance style, alternates a double with a triple twice to make the eight-count basic. Just those two rhythm units can make for an exciting combination and varieties that allow dancers to play with improvisation and syncopations, showmanship, choreography, teamwork, technique and rhythm accuracy.


The challenge to today's danc-

style.

The Championships (ALHC) offers 16 contest categories for competitors aged 10 to 100+. Dance types covered include any of the swing dance styles, ballroom, Latin, Hustle, Salsa, Balboa, Collegiate Shag, Blues, vernacular jazz, hip hop and more. Attendees also have the option of entering Jack and Jill

contests, lead/follow contests and team divisions.

At this year's event a Top Teacher Award is given to the pro with the most points accumulated through their participation. Pros/teachers require a minimum of 5 dance entries to qualify for any placement. See website for more details.

What is Pro-Am?

The Pro-Am division consists of one professional dancing with one amateur performing a social dance style. Same sex leader and follower is permitted in this division only. We ask competitors to assign him/herself to either Professional or Amateur status suing the following criteria:

A competitor is considered a professional if he or she has—1. Worked at a dance studio as a dance instructor; 2. Rented a facility to teach dancing; and/or, received a total of \$1200 or

The Pro-Am division consists of more in prize money, performone professional dancing with ance fees, dance instruction one amateur performing a social dance style. Same sex pensation for dancing.

The Pro-Am division allows drops, splits, limited side-by-side steps and other non-air steps. Dance styles performed may include Lindy, West Coast, East Coast, Carolina Shag, Balboa, Salsa, Ballroom and Latin or a combination thereof with or without appropriate shine steps.

In a "classic" pro-am only the amateur is judged—and also

judged in his (lead) or her (follow) categories. Gold, silver and bronze medals are awarded.

Our primary goal is to bring quality dance instruction, competition and social dancing together in an environment that people will enjoy as they develop life long friendships and memories providing a work environment for the professional dance instructor to dance, compete, and have fun with their students and fellow professionals.
